You're joining the animal industry and Hartpury at a very exciting time. The global market is growing rapidly. We're also developing ourselves as a centre of excellence for animal training, welfare and performance. Our research and practice is just the start and this is where you can play a part.

BSc Zoology: Campus ecology and biodiversity

Throughout the first year of your BSc Zoology degree, you'll explore the biodiversity of our beautiful campus. In this session, you'll get a taste of what this will involve. You'll do your own surveying, using a range of techniques to discover which species reside on campus.

BSc Human-Animal Interaction with Psychology: Considerations and opportunities

Humans and animals interact with and impact each other in many ways, from animalassisted interventions to conflicts with wildlife. You'll spend time observing some of the animals in our collection and consider the impact of human-animal interactions on animals, as well as the potential benefits to humans.

BSc Animal Behaviour and Welfare: Getting it right

With over 70 species on site, ensuring the welfare of our animals is a big job. In this session, you'll discover how new technology can support us to make decisions to ensure the maximum health and wellbeing of different species from our animal collection. Examine how grimace scales, infrared thermography and behavioural observations are used to gain essential insights into animal welfare.

BSc Bioveterinary Science and BSc Veterinary Biosciences: How do we identify disease?

Understanding the anatomy and physiology of an animal is important for anyone wanting to work in animal health. You'll explore in depth, through a hands-on dissection, the anatomy of an organ to understand how it works, the impact it has on the body and what happens when it's diseased. You'll also take part in a classroom-based activity session learning about how we can identify disease.

BSc Animal Training & Performance, Animal Behaviour and Training (Clinical), Canine Training & Performance and Animal Behaviour and Training with Canine (Clinical): Animal behaviour in practice

In order to better understand animal behaviour and training, we need to observe animals in their normal environment. You'll use our animal facilities to observe two species and discuss how the existing environmental factors and interactions with humans (e.g. daily routines) affect various aspects of their behaviour and training.

1.30pm / 2.30pm / 3.30pm | Student life talks MDC5

There's plenty to keep you busy at Hartpury University and in Gloucestershire. Hear from current students about their experience of life outside lectures.
